# **Aspirus Emergency System Wide Guideline COVID-19**

#### **Dialysis COVID-19 Screening and Treatment Plan**

#### Approved 04.07.2020 16:00

### Screening

- 1. Patients and visitors will be pre-screened before entering the treatment area using the Patient/Visitor Screening Questionnaire
  - a. <u>Unit clerk or designee will wear a mask/gloves/eye protection when screening.</u> (For distance within 6ft)
  - b. Patients
    - i. If patient has symptoms, have them mask and segregate if needed to wait for a driver, or ask them to leave and work with unit to re-schedule treatment
      - a) Patient to call the COVID call center number on the intranet to schedule a test.
      - b) Have the patient go home and call the Call Center during open hours. Patient should tell the Call Center they are a **dialysis patient**.
  - c. If patient needs dialysis treatment, notify the provider and follow steps below.
  - d. Visitors displaying symptoms instruct them to leave the unit and call the COVID call center (Refer to Aspirus Visitors Restrictions guidance)

## Care of Non-Symptomatic Clinic patients

- 1. ALL staff on the treatment floor must wear a mask if within 6 feet of patients
- 2. Disinfecting hard surfaces and high touch area. (Refer to disinfecting checklist for specifics)
- 3. Curtains to be pulled in between each patient station. Use hydrogen peroxide spray on curtains daily at end of day.

## Care of suspected/confirmed patients at AWH:

- 1. Notify the Provider and Infection Prevention
- 2. COVID units CDU and the 0200 hallway, and soon the 0500 hallway.
  - a. Attempt to have the same staff at the hospital take care of the COVID patients as much as possible.
  - b. Clock your time as department 7407
  - c. Follow PPE guidelines posted outside COVID units.
  - d. Work with other dialysis nurses to relieve you, so you can take a break without the mask on.
- 3. Clinic patients done at hospital
  - a. Manager or designee will work with the hospital supervisor to set up the patient with a time/room
  - b. Clock your time as department 7407
  - c. Dialysis nurse meets patient at entrance A at their scheduled time

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- i. Patient will wear a mask
- ii. Take them to patient registration to get checked in/get an armband.
- iii. Continue to run these patients at the hospital until test is confirmed negative
- 4. If hospital resources exhausted, then cohort suspected/confirmed patients on 3<sup>rd</sup> shift TTS
  - a. Follow enhanced droplet precautions.
  - b. Patient will wear a mask at all times.
  - c. Attempt to dedicate staff members

## Care of suspected/confirmed patients at AMH:

- 1. Notify the Provider and Infection Prevention
- 2. While resources allow: If cleared to dialyze in the outpatient clinic
  - a. One patient per shift can be dialyzed in the isolation room with door closed at all times using enhanced droplet precautions.
  - b. Patient will wear a mask at all times.
  - c. A staff member will be dedicated to work with the suspected/positive COVID patient.
  - d. May also cohort all suspected/positive COVID patients on last shift of the day on M/W/F or if needed to move all patients to T/TH/S due to staffing, then cohort patients at the end of that day.

## Care of suspected/confirmed patients at ALH:

- 3. Notify the Provider and Infection Prevention
- 4. If cleared to dialyze in the clinic
  - a. One patient per shift can be dialyzed in the isolation room with door closed at all times using enhanced droplet precautions.
  - b. Patient will wear a mask at all times.
  - c. A staff member will be dedicated to work with the suspected/positive COVID patient.
- 5. May cohort confirmed Covid 19 patients in same shift, last shift of the day
- 6. Refer to room disinfection guidance post treatment

# Care of suspected/confirmed patients at ADSH:

- 1. Notify the Provider and Infection Prevention
  - a. Attempt to have the same staff at the Dialysis Unit take care of the COVID patients as much as possible.

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- b. Follow PPE guidelines per ADSH policy
- c. Work with other dialysis nurses to relieve you, so you can take a break without the mask on.
- d. Patient will wear a mask at all times.
- e. A staff member will be dedicated to work with the suspected/positive COVID patient.
- f. May also cohort all suspected/positive COVID patients on last shift of the day on T/TH/S.
- 2. Refer to room disinfection guidance post treatment
