



Benefits of the Aspirus Swing Bed Program!

Arranging a Stay

Anyone (family, patients or hospital staff) may contact Aspirus regarding the Swing Bed Program. Patients currently at another hospital can ask to coordinate a transfer to Aspirus Swing Bed Program.

Patients need a physician's referral to be eligible for the Swing Bed Program. Insurance benefits must be verified for eligibility.

About Swing Bed...

Aspirus Swing Bed Program is a hospital based skilled-care program designed to help you if you are no longer in need of acute care in a hospital but still need more rehabilitation before you return home.

Even if you have received inpatient care or surgery at another hospital, you can choose Aspirus for Swing Bed Care.

Stays are usually short term (typically days to weeks) and can be used for a variety of conditions including but not limited to: stroke, heart disease, joint replacement and other surgeries, respiratory diseases, and extended antibiotic therapy.

Insurance coverage plays a major role in many patient decisions. In most instances, insurance will dictate which option it will cover. An Aspirus care coordinator can help you in determining your options, what is and is not allowed by Medicare, and the cost effectiveness of each choice.



We Provide the Following Services

- Physical therapy to improve strength, endurance, flexibility, motor control and stability.
- Occupational therapy to improve daily skills such as bathing, dressing and grooming, as well as cognitive skills to help you return to your daily activities.
- Speech therapy to focus on communication skills, problem solving skills and swallowing difficulties.
- Skilled nursing services are available 24 hours a day to provide compassionate care.
- Respiratory therapy to provide oxygen for patients as well as evaluations to determine if you will require oxygen at home.
- Wound care consisting of treatments and dressing changes for wounds such as surgical incisions, ulcers and burns.
- A care coordinator will work with you to make sure you have a smooth return to your home environment. If extended rehabilitation becomes necessary, the care coordinator can help you or your family secure a bed at a local nursing facility.



What You Can Expect

- To meet with your interdisciplinary team (usually your nurse, care coordinator, dietitian, therapists and doctor) weekly to review your progress and discharge plan. Your family/ support system is encouraged to attend.
- To actively participate in your rehab sessions during the week and follow through with nursing on weekends and evenings.
- To wear your own clothing. Three or four changes of clothes are recommended for your Swing Bed stay.
- To be offered recreational activities.
- To have staff assist with arranging transportation to appointments, however, please note Medicare does not cover transportation. Your family can provide transportation if appropriate. Any private pay costs will be discussed prior as able.
