Scalp Cooling

TECHNOLOGY TO ASPIRUS CANCER CENTER

Thanks to the generosity of donors, patients undergoing chemotherapy at Aspirus Cancer Center can now access innovative technology designed to help prevent hair loss during treatment.

The new technology works by lowering the temperature of the scalp. Patients wear a silicone cap attached to a machine that circulates cold water or gel. This causes blood vessels to constrict and reduces blood flow to the scalp, limiting the amount of chemotherapy that reaches hair follicles, so patients retain more of their natural hair.

By reducing chemotherapy-induced alopecia, the technology helps many patients maintain confidence and control over their appearance during an already difficult time.

"Losing hair is one of the most distressing side effects of chemotherapy for many of our patients," said Brianna Rogers, Manager of the Aspirus Cancer Center. "It's more than just a physical change—it can be an emotional and psychological hurdle, as well. The ability to offer scalp cooling technology is a game-changer. It gives patients an opportunity to feel more like themselves, and we are incredibly grateful to our donors for helping to make this possible."

With generous donor contributions, the Aspirus Health Foundation supported wiring updates to support the scalp cooling equipment, an additional infusion chair, patient amenities and

call lights to assist the patients' ability to communicate with staff. It's heartwarming to witness patients feel empowered by the option to preserve their hair.

"When we introduced this system, we immediately saw the positive impact it had," Rogers added. "It's heartwarming to witness patients feel empowered by the option to preserve their hair."

In addition to this new technology, gifts to the Foundation have assisted cancer patients in many other ways over the past year. Donor gifts have been used to purchase aromatherapy patches to address nausea, educational materials, activities for patients and family members, port shirts for convenient access to a medical port without the need to fully undress, fanny packs to hold at-home infusion pumps, cryotherapy gloves and socks to reduce the risk of neuropathy, and many other important initiatives that can make a tremendous difference for patients while they are going through treatment.

NICU Cameras

PROVIDE COMFORT AND CONVENIENCE FOR PARENTS

Seven weeks before her due date, Makenzie Thurs's water broke as she was working in the birthing center at Aspirus Wausau Hospital.

Plans took an unexpected turn for first-time parents Makenzie and Tony. Doctors confirmed the baby was breech and needed to be delivered via emergency cesarean section.

Baby Tatum arrived at just 32 ¹/₂ weeks, weighing 3lbs 10 ounces. Her premature birth prompted the need to transfer her to the Anya Marie Jackson Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Aspirus Wausau Hospital.

Thankfully, Tatum only had to spend two weeks in the NICU. For many families, though, this means they must balance the need to be with their newborn while also managing responsibilities at home, work and beyond. That separation adds an extra layer of stress during an already difficult and emotional time.

Thanks to the generous support of donors through the Aspirus Health Foundation, NICU cameras were recently upgraded with the latest NICVIEW secure system and installed in each of the NICU's 20 rooms to help families like the Thurs stay connected to their premature babies any time—day or night—even when they can't physically be with them.

"We could watch over her and once we went home, Tony and I shared the link with our family," shared Makenzie. "Thanks to all of the wonderful NICU nurses, I never had a doubt that our baby was getting the absolute best care and I knew she was already loved in the NICU. I was able to connect with Tatum from the very beginning while I was still recovering as an in-patient. The cameras gave us an extra layer of trust and the added comfort of knowing she was okay."

Through NICVIEW, parents can feel connected with their newborn when separated, and relatives can see their new family member, offering a sense of reassurance and emotional support. For the care team, it enhances communication and collaboration with families, ensuring they are involved in every step of their baby's care journey.

These life-changing resources are only possible because of donor generosity. By supporting advancements like NICU cameras, our donors help provide peace of mind to parents while ensuring our tiniest patients receive the best possible care from the very beginning.

The Aspirus Stevens Point Hospital Breast Care Center offers all-encompassing breast care, including mammograms, ultrasound, biopsy, pathology, surgery, reconstruction, radiation oncology and medical oncology all from one caring, collaborative team

This innovative technology, made possible thanks to a generous gift from Joe and Cindy Kinsella of Almond, Wisconsin, will provide a more seamless and compassionate patient experience.

"This opportunity and breast biopsy technology hit home for us," Cindy Kinsella said. "We just knew it was something we wanted to do and we are fortunate to be able to provide the funding necessary to help ensure quality, close-to-home health care."

The new breast biopsy system replaces technology installed when the Breast Care Center opened in 2018 and will dramatically shorten what can be

uncomfortable and anxious exam times for patients.

"With this new technology, radiologists can obtain real-time sample imaging and point-of-care biopsy verification without ever needing to leave the patient's side," said Tracy Rekowski, Aspirus Stevens Point Hospital Imaging Services Manager. "It provides exceptional image quality and integrated pain management, which can reduce patient discomfort, anxiety, stress and potential complications."

A LIFE RECLAIMED:

Jane's Journey

Doug and Jane Schwanz had long enjoyed the tranquility of their lake home in Presque Isle, Wisconsin, a haven since their retirement in 1999. to recover. By October 12, she was deemed a candidate for rehabilitation. Over the following weeks, Jane worked diligently in therapy, relearning how to walk, talk, and manage daily tasks and move independently.

But on the night of September 5, 2022, their lives took an unexpected turn. After a day filled with laughter and plans for the future, Jane suffered a severe fall, resulting in a wound near her right eye and temple.

Doug immediately called 911 and an ambulance arrived swiftly, taking Jane to Aspirus Howard Young Medical Center in Woodruff. Watching her leave was a heart-wrenching moment for Doug, who followed behind through worsening weather. At the hospital, Jane's condition was critical, with a CT scan revealing bleeding on the brain. She was soon

transferred to Aspirus Wausau Hospital due to the severity of her injuries.

Arriving at the hospital, Doug was met with the sight of Jane in the Medical Surgical Intensive Care Unit (MSICU), connected to life support and surrounded by dedicated medical staff. Doctors assured him the brain bleed was small and improving, but Jane's journey was far from over. Complications arose, including a severe lung infection and pneumonia. Specialists worked tirelessly to stabilize her, while nurses provided both medical care and emotional support for Doug.

On September 7, Doug and Jane marked their 59th wedding anniversary in the MSICU. Though far from the celebration they had envisioned, Doug found solace in the excellent care Jane was receiving. Slowly, she began

Nurses celebrated milestones with them, including Jane's 84th birthday, which they marked in the hospital. Each day brought new challenges, but also small victories that paved the way for her return home.

November 1 was discharge day—a bittersweet moment. Doug and Jane left the hospital, deeply grateful for the compassionate care that had saved Jane's life. They knew their journey was far from over; one of her physicians had aptly described her recovery as a marathon, not a sprint.

In the months that followed, Jane continued

to regain her independence, participating in therapy sessions and embracing daily exercises. By September 2023, she and Doug celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary with a quiet dinner, a testament to resilience and enduring love.

In gratitude for the life-changing care Jane received, Doug and Jane made a heartfelt donation to the MSICU and Rehab Unit at Aspirus Wausau Hospital, wanting to support other families facing similar challenges and to honor the exceptional team that gave them back their life together.

"This team's effort was nothing short of a miracle," Doug reflected. "They gave Jane back her life and mine. For that, we will be forever thankful."


